More than \$10,000 will be awarded in cash and prizes, and more than 250 cars will be on display Saturday, Sept. 7, at the annual Hooker Car Show.

Classic and new automobiles will be showcased at this “fun event perfect for families.” A food court boasting a variety of snack options and several vendors selling unique car-related merchandise.

This year’s event is much more than just a car show, as it includes the PEO 5K Streetwalk and Run. Race check in will begin at 7 a.m. at the Hooker Fire Station at 112 S. Broadway.

Runners will start and finish the race at the fire station. Pre-registration of \$25 includes a T-shirt and breakfast, and race day registration is \$35.

The morning of the car show will also feature the third annual Harley Michele Poker Run. Registration for this begins at 8 a.m. at 121 E. Hwy. 54 in Hooker.

The first bike will go out at 10 a.m., with the last bike out at 11 a.m. Maps are available at the check-in, and cars are welcome as well.

Door prizes, music and food will be part of the fun as well. Drawings will take place for poker hands and the farthest rider.

Registration is \$25 for singles and \$35 for couples, and extra hands are \$10. There will be an after party at Trademark Construction. Proceeds will go to the Hooker EMS and a local child with medical needs. For more information, call 580-651-2611.

The Thrifty Flea will likewise have its grand opening from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. The store is located at 225 E. Gladyas in Hooker. The two story brick building is the oldest and only to survive the fire of 1907.

The store features new, used, handmade and antique items.

“If we don’t have it, we’ll find it,” said the store’s Facebook page.

The grand opening includes door prizes, specials and “fun, fun, fun.”

The Hooker Car Show will also feature shuttle rides.

When you are ready to return to your car, flag down one of the carts.”

Shuttle rides will begin at 10:30 a.m. on Sept. 7.

Keith said Saturday evening, downtown will still be buzzing with live music and drink, so she did not plan a dinner.
