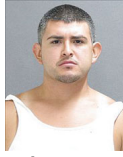

Joshua Domingo Urrutia, 26, is currently facing two charges in Seward County District Court as the result of a dispatched call to the Liberal Police Department Friday morning, July 9. During a scheduling hearing Monday, Urrutia, an employee of Adolescent Support Services, was scheduled for a status review hearing at 10:30 a.m. on Aug. 16, according to Judge Rosanna Volden.

District Attorney Don Scott said Urrutia's bond was set at \$100,000 cash surety, and he is being held in the Seward County Jail.

"He is charged with one count of indecent liberties with a child, one count of sexual intercourse, fondling, touching a child 14 or more years of age but less than 16," Scott said. "This is a Level 3 person felony."

A Level 3 person felony is defined as high risk of repeat offense and a threat to public safety, according to www.wiki.answers.com.

The alleged incident occurred Friday morning when police were dispatched to the 600 block of North Sherman. Officers arrived at the scene to find a man restraining another male while waiting for authorities to arrive. Police also did not allow photographs of the area due to the fact a minor child was involved.

Adolescent Support Services counsels at-risk kids who have usually had run-ins with the law.
