But a one-out rally led to four runs for the Rockies in an improbable 5-3 rally at Rosel Field that moved the Rockies within a half game of the first-place Cardinals.

Malcolm Wiltshire walked to lead of the fifth and stole second. Eriskson Vasquez hit a shot to the White Sox shortstop who fired to first for the out, but Wiltshire advanced to third.

An errant throw from the catcher to pitcher allowed Wiltshire to score and cut the White Sox lead in half, 3-2.

Rodney Pando drove a Sumner pitch to left center that rolled by the left fielder. Burciaga and Warren scored to give the Rockies a 4-3 lead.

Sumner recorded a strike out on Jaden Gustafson for the second out, but Carlos Balderas hit the ball through the gap between first and second that allowed Pando to score and give the Rockies a 5-3 lead.

Burciaga took the mound in the top of the sixth and after walking a batter was able to get two outs. The runner was leading off first, and catcher Warren threw the ball to first base to pick the runner off for the final out to preserve the 5-3 win.

The White Sox dropped to 2-2 on the season while the Rockies won their fourth in a row.

Tonight, action continues in the Liberal Cal Ripken League with the A's squaring off against the Royals. The A's ended a 14-game winning streak for the Royals in their first game of the season.
