The Lady Beavers had a 9-4 run to start the fourth to cut Liberal's lead to 29-24 with 3:52 to play.

Scott City never scored again, and the Lady Redskins ended with a 9-0 run for the 38-24 win.

"You can never relax in basketball," Liberal coach Bill Baird said. "As soon as you do, you are humbled, and I feel a little humbled tonight. We had some ugly turnovers, we didn't rebound like we could and we didn't make shots. But when you win, you can't complain."

Mickens led the Lady redskins with eight points. Despite an all-out effort to take Chapman out of the game, she still scored seven. Ramirez had six, and Jasmine Hernandez had five.
