Has there been some history for the Shockers? Sure. Eddie Fogler had a great run there in the mid to late 1980s.

But it has not been sustainable.

Gregg Marshall is 173-70 at the helm of the program, and he's been there since 2007.

What puts a team in the annals of history, however, is not one coach alone.

A team of history has to have a series of coaches that have been able to maintain success.

Take Kansas, for example. The Jayhawks had legendary coaches like Phog Allen, Ted Owens, Larry Brown, Roy Williams and Bill Self.

The success was maintained from one coach to the next, and that is the sign of a program that has reached a separate level.

In only their second season in recent memory competing in the NCAA tournament with a realistic chance of winning games, the Shockers could be building something special, or they could be a flash in the pan.

None of us really knows nor will we until a few years pass.

For one, the Shockers compete in the Missouri Valley Conference, not exactly a premiere league. That doesn't make Wichita State any less impressive, it just means we don't really know how good they are.
