Cloud County's Jemal Farmer made two free throws with four seconds to play in double overtime Saturday night in Concordia, and that proved to be the game-winner over the Seward County Saints, 94-92.

The Saints had to rally from an eight-point halftime deficit to force overtime, and Thijin Moses had to hit three consecutive free throws with 1 second remaining in the first overtime to force a second.

Seward jumped out to a 92-88 lead, but the Thunderbirds scored the final six points of the game.

Seward has played in four overtime games this season and is now 2-2 in those contests.

Antonio Smith led the Saints with 22 points, Drew Jones scored 20, Moses had 16, Jon Tassin scored 13, Marquez Patterson scored 11, and Marcus James had 10.
