WICHITA — Liberal High School's Kimberly Vanley and Hunter Rinehart placed well last week at the Class 5A-1A state bowling tournament at Northrock Lanes.

Rinehart finished No. 22 in the state overall, bowling a 257-187-189 for 633 total. Rinehart's first game 257 was second only to McPherson's Levi Holgerson, who bowled a first game 266 and finished 10th in the state overall.

Cedric Phillips of Kansas City Washington was the state individual champion, bowling 255-234-225 — 714, two points better than teammate Michael Allen, who bowled a 712.

Washington won the state championship with a team total of 2729.

Other team totals included Bishop Carroll in second place, followed by Topeka Seaman, Kansas City Turner, McPherson, Great Bend, Gardner-Edgerton and Wichita Trinity.

On the girls' side, Kimberly Vanley was 38th overall, bowling 189-147-163 — 499.

Hollyann Johansen of Bishop Carroll was the individual state champion bowling 221-289-246 — 756.

Topeka Seaman won the state team title at 2423, just eight points ahead of second place Buhler. Bishop Carroll was third, followed by Andover Central, Lansing, Tecumseh Shawnee Heights, Great Bend and Kansas City Turner.
