When the Saints lost their first game away from the Green House Friday to an aggressive Odessa defense, Saturday's game could have been a letdown or a rebound.

Seward chose the latter in the second half and rallied from a seven-point halftime deficit to earn a 63-54 win over New Mexico Junior College at the Holiday Classic in Odessa, Texas.

New Mexico was on fire in the first half. New Mexico shot 58 percent from the field, hit seven of 10 free throws, and brought the train with four three pointers on five attempts.
