Neal blocked an Apache punt attempt, and Abbott recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown.

South fumbled another snap to the punter, and Neal scored on an 18- yard run for a 36-0 lead.

West opened the second half with a 61-yard pass from Abbott to Neal for a touchdown and a 43-0 lead.

South scored with 4:23 remaining on a 45-yard drive that ended with a Mauricio Calderon three-yard run for a touchdown.

West responded with a 29-yard touchdown run by Neal for a 50-6 Warrior lead.

West added another score late in the fourth quarter on a nine-yard pass from Abbott to Neal for the 67-6 win.

“We had a couple of players suspended and other with the H1N1 virus,”

South coach Merle Chesbro said. “We had to go to a no-huddle offense.

I was proud of our players. It’s not fun getting beat, but we want to keep working with this offense. For our personnel, it works for us.”

Both teams travel to Garden City Thursday. West (4-1) will face Abe Hubert while South (0-5) will take on Kenneth Henderson.

“What stood out to me was the tremendous effort South gave,” Abbott said. “They started from the get-go and competed. I am excited about these two units are now one unit as they go on.”
