"First off, drive as slow as possible because vision or traction issues, or both, are an issue in the wintertime – drive slowly,"

Standard said. "They may make use of chains if that is appropriate.

"You should always in the wintertime have a blanket in your car. If it's cold in the winter time and the car quits, it would be great to have a blanket in the car to stay warm until the tow truck gets there," he continued. "It is really not a bad idea year round to have a blanket.

Water, in particular, is the most important thing to keep in a vehicle in the event of being stranded.

"Food and water are important, water in particular," he said. "You can be stuck in a blizzard for a day or two and water is just priceless."

With all the preparations and items one can have available to remain safe during a storm, Standard still encourages everyone to stay at home.

"I think I more strongly recommend that you stay home and don't travel," he said. "The solution to the problem is to just stay home."
