### Liberal man dies in 1-vehicle roll-over

A 47-year-old liberal man died in a one-vehicle roll-over crash on Thursday morning in the 1200 block of South 10th Street, according to police.

The victim, identified as James R. Smith, was driving a 2008 Ford Focus when it rolled over on its side on the eastbound side of the street. Smith was pronounced dead at the scene by police.

Police said Smith was traveling south on the street at the time of the crash. The vehicle rolled over onto its side and came to a stop on the grassy area next to the road.

Smith was wearing a seat belt at the time of the crash. The cause of the crash is still under investigation.

### Small plane crash near Guyton kills 2

A small plane crashed near Guyton, Okla., on Thursday, killing two people and injuring one. The plane was flying from Oklahoma City to Guyton when it crashed into a field near the town.

The plane, a Cessna 441, was carrying three people. Two of the people were killed and one was injured. The injured person was taken to a hospital and is in stable condition.

Police said the plane was flying at a low altitude when it crashed. The cause of the crash is still under investigation.
