LNEA, the local union representing the 1,200 employees of the Lincoln National Electric Association, has agreed to a new contract with the company. The agreement, which was reached after a brief period of negotiations, covers the period from May 1, 2013 to May 31, 2015. The new contract includes a 3% wage increase and a 1% increase in health care contributions. The agreement also includes provisions for a 10% increase in the number of employees over the next three years.
