LNEA, district breeze through contract negotiations

LNEA, the local union representing the 1,200 employees of the Lincoln National Electric Association, has agreed to a new contract with the company. The agreement, which was reached after a brief period of negotiations, covers the period from May 1, 2013, to May 31, 2015. The new contract includes a 3% wage increase and a 1% increase in health care contributions. It also includes provisions for a new grievance procedure and a new arbitration process. The agreement was signed by LNEA President John Smith and LNEA General Counsel David Johnson. The agreement was also approved by the LNEA membership at a meeting held on May 6, 2013.
