## Pedestrian may be facing charges after being hit by vehicle when crossing 15th

A vehicle roll-over on 15th Street in Libertyville on Tuesday afternoon injured a pedestrian and left another person with a head injury. The incident occurred at the intersection of 15th Street and North Street. The driver of the vehicle, a 2011 Ford Focus, was cited for driving on the wrong side of the road. The pedestrian, a 35-year-old male, was struck while crossing the street. He is currently in the hospital with a head injury. The driver is being held on a \$10,000 bond.
