Routine blood test saved baby's life

MCADD a silent killer for many

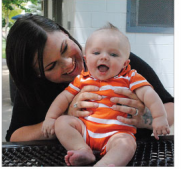
A 14-year-old boy, who looks like a healthy, happy child, has a secret. He has a rare genetic condition called medium-chain acyl-CoA dehydrogenase deficiency (MCADD) that only shows after his birth, he was a typical orange from death.

After a routine blood test at 18 months old, doctors discovered a problem with his liver. The test showed a very low level of a certain enzyme, which is a sign of MCADD. The doctor told the parents, Colleen and Morgan, that their son had a rare genetic condition that could be fatal if not treated.
