MCADD a silent killer for many

At the age of 4 months, Jordan Colston Barnd looks like the healthiest, happiest baby in the world. His parents, Colton and Morgan Barnd, look at their son, they know that only knows after his birth, he was a typical orange from death.

After his mother learned he had MCADD, she was able to start giving him the special diet that has kept him alive and healthy. The diet is a mix of special formulas and natural foods that are safe for him to eat.

Colton and Morgan Barnd are proud parents of Jordan, who is now 4 years old. They say that the special diet has allowed Jordan to live a normal life and that they are grateful for the medical advances that have helped him.

MCADD is a rare genetic disorder that affects the body's ability to break down certain fats. It is often called a "silent killer" because it can be difficult to diagnose and can be fatal if not treated properly.

Colton and Morgan Barnd say that they are grateful for the support they have received from the medical community and from other parents who have children with MCADD. They say that they are committed to keeping Jordan healthy and happy for the rest of his life.
