The Liberal School District has voted to increase its mill levy by 1.3 mills, starting next year. The increase is necessary due to a combination of factors, including a significant drop in property valuations and a reduction in state aid. The district's board of trustees approved the increase by a 4-2 vote. The new mill levy will be 18.3 mills. The district's superintendent, Mr. Sutherland, stated that the increase is a difficult decision but necessary to ensure the district can continue to provide quality education for its students. The increase will affect all property owners in the district.
