 Schepers, 68, of Lawrence, Mo., was elected to the Board of the Kansas Bankers' Association (KBA) at its annual meeting in Overland Park, Mo., on August 20. **Fort Hood shooter convicted on 13 counts of murder**  
 A federal judge in Fort Worth, Texas, has sentenced a man to 13 life terms in prison for the mass shooting at Fort Hood, Texas, in November 2009. The man, identified as Nidal Hasan, was found guilty of 13 counts of murder and one count of attempted murder. He was also sentenced to 100 years in prison for each count of murder. The judge stated that Hasan's actions were premeditated and that he acted with a "cold and calculated" mindset.

**US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, Haskell counties starts**  
 The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) has announced that the US-56 project through Stevens, Seward, and Haskell counties will begin construction in the fall of 2013. The project will include widening the road from two to four lanes in several sections, improving drainage, and upgrading the bridge over the Neosho River. The project is estimated to cost \$15 million and is expected to be completed by the end of 2015.

**Random attack in Spokane leaves WWII veteran dead**  
 A 92-year-old World War II veteran was killed in a random attack in Spokane, Washington, on August 23, 2013. The victim, identified as John Doe, was walking in a park area when he was approached by a man who pulled a knife on him. The man stabbed the veteran in the chest, and he died of his injuries shortly thereafter. The suspect is still at large, and police are currently searching for him. The incident has caused a wave of concern in the community, particularly among the elderly population.
