A federal judge has convicted a man accused of the 2009 Fort Hood shooting on 13 counts of murder. The man, Nidal Hasan, was found guilty of killing 13 people and wounding 30 others. He is facing a life sentence in prison.

Random attack in Spokane leaves WWII veteran dead
A random attack in Spokane, Washington, has left a World War II veteran dead. The victim, 82-year-old Robert J. Smith, was shot in the back by a gunman on August 23, 2013. Smith was a member of the 101st Airborne Division and served in Europe during World War II. He was a member of the American Legion and a member of the Spokane Veterans Affairs Medical Center. The gunman is still at large.
