CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — Egyptian authorities have detained a swan suspected of spying on the country's military base, according to a report from the state-run news agency. The swan was found near the base and was taken to a laboratory for testing. It was found to have a small electronic device attached to its neck, which was used to transmit information to a satellite. The swan was released after the device was removed.

Judge: Oklahoma can sue government for Obamacare

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — A federal judge has ruled that the state of Oklahoma can sue the federal government for the Affordable Care Act, also known as Obamacare. The judge, Judge David B. Senturia, ruled in favor of Oklahoma's lawsuit, which was filed in 2010. The lawsuit claims that the federal government violated the Commerce Clause of the U.S. Constitution by forcing the state to implement the law. The judge's ruling is a significant victory for Oklahoma and its supporters.
