**KBI investigating incident involving Kansas sheriff**  
TOPEKA, Kan. — The Kansas Bureau of Investigation is investigating an incident involving a Topeka sheriff and a KBI agent. The incident occurred on September 17, 2013, at the Topeka Sheriff's Office. The KBI agent was visiting the sheriff's office when a physical altercation occurred. The sheriff, who is a member of the KBI, was charged with assault on a law enforcement officer. The sheriff is currently on administrative leave. The KBI is conducting an ongoing investigation into the incident. The sheriff's attorney has not yet commented on the incident.

**Hutchinson regional hospital settles federal allegations of Medicare false claims**  
HUTCHINSON, Kan. — Hutchinson Regional Medical Center has settled federal allegations of Medicare false claims. The settlement, announced by the U.S. Department of Justice, resolves a lawsuit filed in 2011. The lawsuit alleged that the hospital had submitted false claims to Medicare, including billing for services that were not provided. The settlement amount was not disclosed. **Topeka expands anti-discrimination ordinance**  
TOPEKA, Kan. — The Topeka City Council has expanded its anti-discrimination ordinance to include gender identity and expression. The ordinance, which was passed on September 17, 2013, prohibits discrimination in housing, employment, and public accommodations on the basis of gender identity and expression. The ordinance is the first of its kind in Kansas. The city council members who voted in favor of the ordinance are Mayor Tom Sawyer, Councilmembers Dan Blevins, Jeffery Blevins, and Jeffery Blevins. The ordinance is effective immediately.
