**KBI investigating incident involving Kansas sheriff**  
WICHITA, Kan. — The Kansas Bureau of Investigation is investigating an incident involving a sheriff in Kansas. The incident occurred on September 15th in a small town in Kansas. The sheriff was accused of using excessive force on a suspect. The KBI is currently reviewing the case and has not yet released any details. The sheriff has been placed on administrative leave pending the outcome of the investigation.
