**Potential litigation?
 School board closes meeting for hypothetical purpose**

 A school board meeting was closed Tuesday night for a hypothetical purpose, a move that could lead to potential litigation, according to a local attorney.

The board of the Scott County School District closed its meeting Tuesday night after discussing a potential lawsuit filed against the district by a parent. The lawsuit alleges that the district violated the Freedom of Information Act by not releasing certain information.

The board's attorney, Michael J. O'Connell, said the board's decision to close the meeting was a precautionary measure to avoid any potential legal issues.

The board is scheduled to meet again on Wednesday night.
