School board closes meeting for hypothetical purpose

The school board of the Liberty Union School District closed its meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 24, for a hypothetical purpose, a move that could lead to potential litigation, according to a local attorney.
The board, which meets on the second Tuesday of each month, closed its meeting at 7:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 24, after a discussion about a potential lawsuit filed by a parent against the district. The lawsuit, filed in the Circuit Court of the 11th Judicial Circuit in DuPage County, alleges that the district violated the Illinois Freedom of Information Act by not releasing certain information about the district's financial records.
The attorney, who did not provide a name, said the lawsuit is a "hypothetical" and that the district's decision to close the meeting was a "precautionary" measure to avoid potential litigation.
