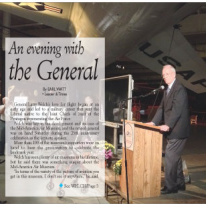

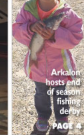
Vision Team hopes for more community input

WASHINGTON (AP) — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is considering a permit to drill for oil on a wetland in Kansas. The permit is part of a larger effort to increase oil production in the state. However, the drilling has raised concerns among environmental groups and local residents who worry about the impact on the wetland ecosystem and water quality.

Kan. agencies warn of algae threat to hunting dogs

TOPEKA (AP) — Kansas agencies are warning of a threat to hunting dogs from a type of algae. The algae, known as cyanobacteria, can be toxic to dogs if they ingest it. The warning is based on reports of dogs becoming ill after eating algae from a pond. The agencies are advising dog owners to keep their dogs away from bodies of water and to monitor their dogs for any signs of illness.

Justice Dept to sue North Carolina over voter law

WASHINGTON (AP) — The U.S. Justice Department is preparing to sue North Carolina over a new voter law. The law, which restricts the ability of voters to cast absentee ballots, is seen as a violation of the Voting Rights Act. The Justice Department is arguing that the law is discriminatory and that it undermines the integrity of the electoral process.
