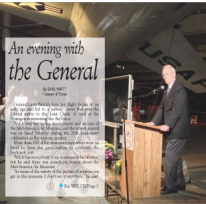

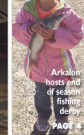
Vision Team hopes for more community input

Feds consider permit to drill on Kansas wetlands

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers is considering a permit to drill for oil on a wetland in Kansas. The permit is for a well that would be drilled on a wetland near the town of Pratt. Her attorney has not yet commented on the case.

Justice Dept to sue North Carolina over voter law

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Justice Department is preparing to sue North Carolina over its new voter ID law. The Justice Dept. is arguing that the law is unconstitutional. The law requires voters to show a government-issued photo ID at the polls. The Justice Dept. is claiming that the law is a violation of the U.S. Constitution. The suit is expected to be filed in the U.S. District Court in North Carolina.
