Kansas death penalty case goes to US Supreme Court
 The U.S. Supreme Court has agreed to hear a case that could limit the number of states that can execute prisoners. The case involves a man who was sentenced to death in Kansas in 1994 but whose sentence was later overturned by the state's Supreme Court. The U.S. Supreme Court will hear the case in the fall.
