Kansas death penalty case goes to US Supreme Court
The U.S. Supreme Court has agreed to hear the case of a man sentenced to death in Kansas for the murder of a woman. The case, *Heckler v. Commonwealth of Kansas*, will be argued in November and decided in January. The man, James Earl Ray, was sentenced to death in 1976 for the murder of a woman. The case is significant because it involves the issue of whether a state can execute a person who has been sentenced to death in another state.
