2 juveniles charged in Fla. after bullied 12-year-old girl's suicide

WELLS RICHES, Fla. — A 12-year-old girl's suicide in a small town in Florida has led to the arrest of two juveniles in the state's largest city. The girl, who was bullied for years, took her own life last week. The police are investigating the case and have charged two juveniles with the girl's death.
