Mental health care suffers drought season
Cuts cause 'unnecessary suffering, raises risk of crisis'

A lack of funding for mental health services in New Jersey is causing "unnecessary suffering" and raising the risk of crisis for many people, according to a report from the state's Department of Human Services. The report, released last week, says that cuts to mental health services have led to a significant increase in the number of people who are hospitalized for mental health issues. It also notes that the state's mental health system is in a state of crisis, with many services being cut or reduced. The report calls for increased funding and a focus on prevention and early intervention to reduce the need for hospitalization.
