Asian nations dominate international test

WASHINGTON (AP) — Asian nations dominated an international test of mathematics and science, with South Korea and Singapore leading the way. The results were announced Tuesday by the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD). Singapore topped the list with a score of 554, followed by South Korea at 553. The United States ranked 25th with a score of 487. The test, known as PISA, is designed to assess the ability of 15-year-olds to apply their knowledge in real-world situations. It is the first time that the United States has participated in the test since 2006. The results show that the United States is still behind many other developed nations in terms of math and science education. The OECD said that the United States needs to focus on improving the quality of its education system, particularly in the areas of math and science. The test is a key indicator of a country's economic competitiveness, and the results are used by governments to guide their education policies.
