Asian nations dominate international test

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) — Asian nations dominated an international test of 11-year-olds' math skills on Tuesday, with South Korea and Singapore leading the pack.

The results of the Progress in International Reading and Literacy Study (PIRLS) were announced Tuesday by the International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA).

South Korea scored highest, followed by Singapore, Hong Kong and the Netherlands. The United States ranked 25th, with a score of 558 out of 1,000 possible points.

The test, which was administered in 11 countries, measured students' reading and math skills. It was the first time that the United States participated in the test.

The results show that Asian students are generally better at reading and math than their American counterparts. This is likely due to the emphasis on these subjects in the Asian education system.

The PIRLS test is a large-scale assessment of reading and math skills for 11-year-olds. It is the only international assessment of reading and math skills for this age group.
