Asian nations dominate international test

TOKYO — Asian nations dominated an international test of mathematics and science skills, with South Korea and China leading the way. The results of the 2012 Trends in International Mathematics and Science Study (TIMSS) were announced Tuesday.

The study, which is conducted every four years, tests 4th and 8th graders in mathematics and science. It is the largest international assessment of student achievement in the world. The 2012 TIMSS was the first to include data on students' attitudes toward school and learning.

South Korea topped the list in mathematics, with a score of 584. China followed with a score of 579. The United States scored 534, which is slightly below the average of 533. The lowest score was from the Dominican Republic, with a score of 314.

In science, South Korea also led with a score of 579, followed by China with a score of 574. The United States scored 529, which is slightly below the average of 528. The lowest score was from the Dominican Republic, with a score of 314.

The TIMSS results show that Asian students generally perform better than their Western counterparts. This is likely due to a combination of factors, including a strong emphasis on mathematics and science in the Asian education system, as well as a cultural emphasis on hard work and discipline.
