Robertson, who is the oldest son of the show's host, Willie Robertson, made the comments during an interview with a conservative talk show. He said that he believed that gay people were a curse on the land and that he would not have his children marry someone of the same sex.

The comments were widely criticized and led to a boycott of the show. The show's network, A&E, announced that Robertson would be removed from the show. Robertson has since apologized for his comments and has said that he is a proud Christian.
