WASHINGTON — The Supreme Court has twice delayed the implementation of the Affordable Care Act's birth control mandate, a move that has frustrated advocates and opponents alike. State attorneys general claim ObamaCare changes are illegal



WASHINGTON — A coalition of 26 state attorneys general has filed a lawsuit with the Supreme Court, claiming that the Affordable Care Act's changes to the way health care is financed are unconstitutional. The lawsuit, filed in the U.S. District Court in Washington, D.C., challenges the law's provisions that allow the federal government to take over the financing of state health care programs. The attorneys general argue that these provisions violate the Tenth Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which reserves powers not delegated to the federal government to the states or to the people.

ObamaCare brings new taxes, fees for 2014

WASHINGTON — The Obama administration has announced that it will begin collecting new taxes and fees from employers and individuals starting in 2014. The new taxes include a 2.3 percent excise tax on high-cost medical devices, a 3.8 percent net investment income tax, and a 3.8 percent tax on unearned income for high-income earners. The new fees include a 0.9 percent increase in the Medicare payroll tax and a 3.8 percent increase in the Medicare surcharge for high-income earners. The administration says that the new taxes and fees will raise an estimated \$130 billion in additional revenue over the next five years.
