Incumbent Linenbroker has filed to run for re-election to the county commission. The election is scheduled for a later date.

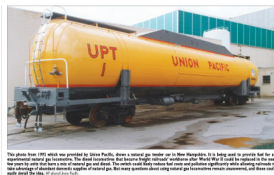
### Education efforts expand to election
