Incumbent Linenbroker has filed to run for re-election to the county commission. He is currently serving his second term and is seeking a third term. The election will be held in the next few months.

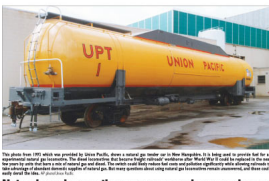
Education efforts expand to election
