**Kan. high court upholds Hugoton homicide verdict**

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — The Kansas Supreme Court has upheld the homicide verdict against a man accused of shooting a woman in Hugoton in 2007.

The court's decision in *State v. Hines* means the man's conviction for first-degree murder stands. The court also affirmed the 20-year prison sentence.

Hines was charged with the murder of a woman in Hugoton in 2007. The woman was shot in the back of the head while she was in the back seat of a car. Hines was the driver and the woman was the passenger.

The court's decision is final. Hines was sentenced to 20 years in prison. He is currently serving his sentence in the state prison system.
