Kan. high court upholds Hugoton homicide verdict

WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — The Kansas Supreme Court has upheld the homicide verdict against a man accused of shooting a woman in Hugoton in 2007.

The court's decision in *State v. Hines* is the latest in a series of rulings that have upheld the state's "stand-your-ground" law, which allows a person to use deadly force if they believe it is necessary to protect themselves or others.

Hines was charged with first-degree murder after shooting a woman in Hugoton in 2007. He was found guilty of second-degree murder and sentenced to life in prison.

The court's decision in *Hines* is a significant victory for the state's "stand-your-ground" law, which has been challenged in several other cases.

Gun fight: Smith & Wesson, Ruger quit California over stamping requirement



WICHITA, Kan. (AP) — Two major gun manufacturers, Smith & Wesson and Ruger, have announced they are quitting California over a new stamping requirement.

The requirement, which went into effect in January, mandates that all firearms sold in California must have a "CALIFORNIA" stamp on the receiver.

Smith & Wesson and Ruger argue that the requirement is an unconstitutional infringement on their right to sell their products in the state.
