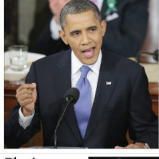

President Barack Obama is expected to announce a "practical" agenda focusing on immigration, income equality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The official said the president will likely announce the agenda in the next few weeks, but declined to say exactly when.
