Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Barack Obama is expected to announce a "practical" agenda focusing on immigration, income equality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The official said the agenda would be unveiled in the coming weeks, but declined to provide more details. Obama's agenda is expected to be a response to the economic challenges facing the country, including the high unemployment rate and the need to attract investment. The official said the agenda would be "practical" and "focused on the issues that matter most to the American people." The agenda is expected to include measures to improve the economy, create jobs, and address the needs of the middle class. Obama's agenda is expected to be a key part of his re-election campaign in 2016.
