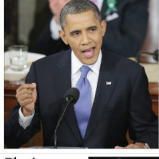

Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

President Barack Obama is set to announce a "practical" agenda focusing on immigration, income equality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The agenda is expected to be unveiled in the coming weeks, and will focus on areas where the president can make a difference without needing Congress. The official said that the agenda will include proposals for immigration reform, such as a pathway to citizenship for undocumented immigrants, and for income equality, such as raising the minimum wage and strengthening labor protections. The official also said that the agenda will include proposals for education reform, such as expanding charter schools and increasing federal funding for public schools.
