Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

WASHINGTON, Jan. 27 (AP) — President Barack Obama is expected to announce a new set of policies aimed at addressing immigration, income inequality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The official said the president will likely announce the plan in the next few days. The plan is expected to focus on creating jobs, improving education and training, and addressing the needs of low-income families.
