Obama set to announce 'practical' agenda focusing on immigration, income equality

President Barack Obama is expected to announce a "practical" agenda focusing on immigration, income equality and other issues, according to a senior administration official. The official said the president will likely announce the agenda in the next few weeks, possibly during his State of the Union address in January. The agenda is expected to include measures to address the needs of immigrants, particularly those who are undocumented, and to promote economic growth and job creation. It may also include proposals for tax reform and infrastructure investment. The official said the president will be looking for bipartisan support for the agenda, and that it will be a "practical" approach to addressing the challenges facing the country.
