Congressional analysts say health care law means fewer on job

Two top congressional analysts say the health care law means fewer jobs will be created than expected. The analysts, from the Congressional Budget Office and the Joint Committee on Taxation, said the law's provisions for expanding Medicaid and other programs would cost more than they would save.
