2 men drop their federal lawsuit over Kansas voter ID law

Two men have dropped their federal lawsuit challenging Kansas' voter ID law. The lawsuit, filed in federal court in Kansas City, sought to block the state's requirement that voters show a government-issued photo ID at the polls. The men, who were represented by the American Civil Liberties Union, announced their decision to drop the suit after a settlement was reached with the state.
