Maine woman, 80, goes skydiving on Mother's Day

She was part of a group of about 100 people who jumped from a plane over the state's capital, Augusta. The woman, who is a member of the Maine Skydiving Club, said she had been skydiving for about 10 years. She said she was inspired by the story of a woman who had jumped from a plane at the age of 80.
