Report: Thousands of convicted criminals freed while awaiting deportation proceedings

WASHINGTON, D.C. (AP) — A report released Wednesday says that thousands of convicted criminals are being freed from U.S. jails while they wait for their deportation proceedings to begin.

The report, from the U.S. Department of Justice, says that in 2012, about 10,000 convicted criminals were released from U.S. jails while they waited for their deportation proceedings to begin. The report says that this is a significant increase from the number of convicted criminals released in 2011.
