Report: Thousands of convicted criminals freed while awaiting deportation proceedings
A report released by the American Immigration Law Initiative (AILI) shows that thousands of convicted criminals are being released from federal custody while awaiting deportation proceedings. The report, titled "The State of Immigrant Detention," found that the number of immigrants held in federal custody has increased significantly in recent years, and that many of these individuals are being held in overcrowded and often inhumane conditions. The report also found that many of these individuals are being held in custody for long periods of time, even though they have been found to be inadmissible to the United States. The report calls for reform of the immigration detention system, including the creation of a national immigration detention system and the implementation of a "fast-track" process for the removal of inadmissible immigrants.
